Renal pathology fellows in our program have a great exposure to a large number and a great variety of mostly native kidney biopsies for medical kidney disease. Our Renal Pathology Service processes about 1,600 kidney biopsies per year, a majority of which come from referring institutions across the country. Our fellows assume significant clinical responsibilities that include a detailed examination and description of the kidney biopsy findings at the light, immunofluorescence, and electron microscopy level, formulation of preliminary diagnoses, review of the findings with the staff pathologist, a preliminary communication with the attending nephrologists, and the preparation of the final report. Fellows attend in-house native and transplant kidney biopsy procedures with the nephrologists to assess specimen adequacy. Fellows also actively participate in monthly Clinicopathologic Conferences with Nephrology Division, as well as a variety of other conferences in the Departments of Pathology and Internal Medicine. Fellows are also encouraged to take part in teaching of medical students and residents. MD or MD/PhD is required, with minimum three years AP training.
