The Department of Pathology & Immunology at Washington University School of Medicine, Division of Anatomic and Molecular Pathology, is recruiting a full-time faculty member to join the Nephropathology Section. The successful candidate must have training and experience in medical and transplant renal biopsy interpretation, including immunofluorescence and electron microscopy findings. Applicants must be board certified in Anatomic Pathology and eligible for medical license in the state of Missouri. A record of publications is expected. The successful candidate will participate in general surgical pathology service so other subspecialty interests or certifications are desirable. Candidates should possess strong interpersonal skills and will be expected to participate in resident, pathology & nephrology fellow and medical student education, as well as clinical, translational, or basic science research activities within the academic mission of the Nephropathology Section. Collaborative clinical and academic relationships with members of the Divisions of Nephrology and Transplantation and the recently established O'Brian Kidney Center are excellent.

The nephropathology service is busy and includes challenging diagnostic material from the entire Midwestern area. The service accession cases from both adult and pediatric populations, including 200 transplant biopsies per year. A large pathology residency program is in place. Scholarship is a major goal of the department. Substantial protected time is provided for pursuit of academic and research interests. Salary and rank will be based upon training and experience.
