The important part of this program are poster presentations which you will be able to attend during the breaks on the  $2^{nd}$  floor of the venue. The best posters will be awarded.

We believe that the conference program will be of interest not only to renal pathologists and adult and pediatric nephrologists, but also rheumatologists, family medicine doctors, clinical geneticists, members of kidney transplant teams, as well as those from basic medical research of kidney physiology and pathology.
